## Traditional Caskets & Professional Services

Whether we are planning in advance or we are faced with the unfortunate situation of a passing of a loved one, arranging for a funeral can be a difficult. One of the most sensitive, yet important, decisions that must be made is what type of casket will be selected.

Someone experiencing a loss may not be sure on how to select the right casket. There really is no set process on how to choose this lasting tribute. Many varieties of caskets exist. The most practical advice is consider the personality of your loved one and costs.

If you or your loved one are religious, there are several traditional or religious themed caskets available. Caskets can also come in other materials that may be more suited to your loved one's tastes or personality. They may be made with wood, steel or cloth. These three different types of caskets are categorized as 'protective' and 'non protective'. A funeral director will be able to explain these differences.

## Professional Services of the traditional funeral

**Local Transportation** Any transportation, home, hospital or nursing home within Lunenburg, Annapolis & Queens is considered local transportation.

**Conference** with a licensed Funeral Director to secure necessary and pertinent information, including obituary information, service details, with visitation hours, etc.

**Authorization for Preparation & Restoration** - legal next of kin or executor/trix to sign this authorization on behalf of the estate for the preparation process

**Secure & Finalize Legal Requirements** The funeral director will be legally responsible to complete and file : *Nova Scotia Registration of Death and Nova Scotia Burial Permit*. In return, will provide to the arranger, Funeral Directors Statement of Death, so details of the estate can be finalized with proper death certificates.

**Professional Staffing, Facilities, Vehicles & Documentation** The funeral director will provide : Eight (8) certified Statements of Death, Completion of CPP death benefit forms, Assist with insurance or benefit applications, Prepare, record, edit and submit obituary, Arrange public announcements, Record charitable donations, Provide email messages and website access

**Service of Remembrance, Funeral or Memorial & Burial :** The funeral director and staff will help, arrange, assist and attend to the public or private memorial service and burial. At the completion of the service, the family will receive from the Director, all legal and memorial documentation. Record and maintain memorial donation records; Website services; After-care.
